2018 Suzanne Winsor Freeman Memorial Student Genealogy Grant

The Suzanne Winsor Freeman Memorial Student Genealogy Fund was established to honor Suzanne's Freeman's lifetime of service to young people and to assist young genealogists seeking to advance their genealogical education.

Suzanne Freeman was a life-long volunteer who worked with many youth organizations in the capacity of leader, organizer, and administrator. Born in Olathe, Kansas, Suzanne moved to Orange County, California with her family in the early 1930s where she attended school and lived most of her life. She developed a strong interest in family history sparked by the stories of her mother's early life in Colorado and Kansas.

After retirement Suzanne moved to Green Valley, Arizona where she was active in the local genealogy society. She enjoyed returning to Southern California each year in June to attend the Southern California Genealogical Society Jamboree. At the time of her death in Tucson, Arizona August 28, 2010, Suzanne was searching for elusive Winsor cousins and adding more stories to her family history.

The \$500 cash award pays tribute to these interests by awarding the annual cash grant to a young genealogist attending the SCGS Jamboree. In addition, a complimentary three-day conference registration to the Southern California Genealogical Society Jamboree will be provided by Jamboree.

Applicant Eligibility Requirements

- Applicant must be between the ages of 18 and 23 as of June 1, 2018.
- Applicant must have been enrolled in a college, university, or secondary school within the last twelve months.
- All Grant Application materials including Letters of Recommendation must be received via email by April 10, 2018, midnight Pacific Time.
- The Grant recipient must attend the 2018 Southern California Genealogical Society Jamboree June 1-2, 2018 in Burbank, California to accept the award. No funds for travel or accommodation are provided.

Application Instructions

Application materials should be sent by email to swfgrant@gmail.com with your last name in the subject line (Surname, SWF Grant Application).

- 1. Complete Grant Application Form.
- Request TWO letters of recommendation from individuals who can attest to your genealogy experience and interest. These may be letters of any length commenting on a specific research experience or academic accomplishment in the field of family history observed by the individual. Letters must be received no later than April 10, 2018.
 - a. One letter of recommendation from a non-immediate family member, such as aunt, uncle, grandparent, etc.

- b. One letter from an individual in the genealogy or academic community, such as college instructor, family history center director, or genealogist (does not need to be a professional) who can attest to your interest, genealogy volunteerism and/or skill in family history research.
- c. Letters should be emailed directly by the individual to swfgrant@gmail.com with your SURNAME/SWF Grant in the Subject Line.
- 3. Sign and date the application form.
- 4. Email the completed application via email by midnight Saturday, April 10, 2018, Pacific Time to swfgrant@gmail.com. An email receipt will verify successful receipt of your application. Late applications will not be considered.

The award recipient will be notified on or before April 20, 2018.

Only successfully received electronic submissions will be considered for the award. Recipient must attend the 2018 SCGS Jamboree in Burbank, California. The decision of the grant committee is final. Sponsor reserves the right to award more or less Grants, or not to award any Grant, if, in their sole discretion, a sufficient number of qualified applications is not received.
